DESTINATION: TANZANIA

• **DAR ES SALAAM:** The largest city and the political and economic capital of Tanzania, Dar es Salaam is located in a quiet bay on the Indian Ocean coast. The metropolis has grown in economic importance to become a prosperous center for the East African region. Its bustling harbor is Tanzania's main port and its industrial area produces goods for export and domestic use. Government offices are all based in Dar es Salaam and diplomatic missions and non-governmental

organizations all have a presence here. The National Museum, Village Museum and various markets are well worth a visit.

• **ARUSHA:** In the northern highlands of Tanzania, between the twin peaks of mounts Meru and Kilimanjaro, Arusha is the safari capital of the country. The town is ideally located near the major national parks, and its highland setting makes it a peaceful and relaxing idyll before the start of an exciting journey. Built by the

Germans as a center of colonial administration in the early 20th century, Arusha was a sleepy town with a garrison stationed at the old German Boma (a fortified compound). The Boma is now a natural history museum; the area is also home to some great craft shops. Despite its backwater status amid the farmlands, Arusha is now one of the country's most prosperous towns.

• **SELOUS GAME RESERVE:** The Tanzanian reserve, covering around

15,250sq miles, is among the largest protected areas in Africa and is relatively undisturbed. It's home to one of the most significant concentrations of elephants, black rhinos, cheetahs, giraffes, hippos and crocodiles in the world. The reserve, a UNESCO World Heritage Site located in the south of the country, also has a large variety of habitats, including Miombo woodlands, open grasslands and riverine forests, making it a valuable lab for ecological conservation.
